

### **Average Median Income (AMI) Reduction in Monetary Threshold**

Pursuant to Election Law § 14-203(2), in order to be eligible for public matching funds, a participating candidate must raise a minimum threshold amount of money and receive a minimum number of matchable contributions. For example, candidates running for the New York State Senate must raise a minimum of \$12,000 in matchable contributions and receive at least 150 matchable contributions (\$5-\$250) from in-district residents.

In districts where the median household income is below the state's median household income, the minimum monetary threshold for eligibility is reduced by one-third. This means that in such districts, the monetary threshold for the State Senate would be reduced to \$8,000.

Below is a list of Senate Districts that qualify for the reduced \$8,000 threshold.
